No. 239. Read the following letter from the Inspector General, Medical Department, to the Chief Secretary to Government, Fort Saint George; dated Fort Saint George, 12th April 1867, No. 136.

Adverting to this office letters marginally noted, I have the honor to bring to the notice of Government that Native Nos. 73 and 98, of 28th February and 16th March 1867. Surgeon J. Rajantheram has submitted a petition praying that, should Government appoint him to the medical charge of the projected Dispensary at Ramnad, they may be pleased to authorise the disbursement to him of the usual Dispensary allowance of 50 Rupees per mensem, either from the public exchequer, or by the Zemindar of Ramnad.

2. I beg to report, for the information of Government, that Apothecaries appointed to the independent charge of Civil Dispensaries are invariably granted the allowance, some by Government, as at Conjeveram, Combaconum, and Negapatam, &c.; and others by the people, as at Bimlipatam. Native Surgeons are generally employed under the orders of the Zillah Surgeon, and, except in a few instances, do not hold *independent* charge of Dispensaries. Mr. Rajantheram, however, has been recommended for independent medical charge of a station and Dispensary far away from the Sudder station, and in a district notoriously unhealthy, and liable to annual outbreaks of epidemics during the Hindoo festival. As Government provide European medicines and the salary of the Native Surgeon, the Zemindar defraying only the limited current expenses of the Institution and menial establishment, he may probably be willing to meet the monthly allowance of 50 Rupees to the Native Surgeon; I have, therefore, the honor to recommend the petition of the Native Surgeon for the favorable consideration of Government.

No. 240. ORDER THEREON, 26th June 1867, No. 742.

It is observed that the order transferring Native Surgeon J. Rajantheram to the Ramnad Estate Dispensary has been cancelled by the G. O. dated 24th April 1867, and that Native Surgeon Anthony Pillay has been placed in charge of the Dispensary.

2. With reference to paragraph 2 of the foregoing letter, the Governor in Council sanctions the payment to Native Surgeon Anthony Pillay of the extra allowance of Rupees (50) fifty per mensem usually granted to Medical Subordinates in sole charge of Civil Dispensaries.
