No. 9. Read the following letter from the Secretary to the Government of India, Home Department, (Public,) to the Chief Secretary to Government, Fort Saint George; dated Simla, 2nd May 1869, No. 2027.

I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter, No. 343, dated 18th March last, on the subject of emigration fees, and in reply to point out that, under the Convention with France, it is not open to the Government of India to impose higher fees in connexion with emigration to French Colonies, than those levied on emigration to English dependencies.

2. The Governor General in Council will, however, be ready uniformly to enhance emigration fees to such an extent (within the limits fixed by Section 9, Act VI. of 1869) as the Government of Madras may report to be needed, in order to protect the State against loss on the whole.

No. 10. ORDER THEREON, 1st June 1869, No. 732.

The Government resolve to refer the foregoing letter to the Accountant General and the Protector of Emigrants, who are requested to state whether it is possible by raising the Dépôt and Recruiters' license fees, and the fee for registration of emigrants before the Protector* to the full

limit of double the amount prescribed in Section 9, Act VI. of 1869, to render the

Emigration Fee Funds solvent, or whether a less increase would suffice.

2. The Accountant General is requested to submit a Memorandum showing the amounts received in fees under the several sections of the Act from 1865-66 to 1868-69, and the charges for the same period. It is observed that the rates of fees in connexion with emigration to the French Colonies cannot be raised beyond those levied on emigration to the English Colonies.
