No. 41. Read the following letter from the President of the Cumbum Municipal Commission, to the Chief Secretary to Government, Fort Saint George; dated Kurnool, 18th May 1869, No. 10.

Adverting to Government Order, No. 506, dated 20th April 1869, I have the honour to forward, for the information of Government, the accompanying letter from Mr. McCarthy on the subject of carts used in the Cumbum Municipality.

From S. T. M. CARTHY, Esq., Vice-President of the Cumbum Municipal Commission, to the President of the Cumbum Municipal Commission, Kurnool; dated Cumbum, 15th May 1869, No. 27.

With reference to paragraph 4 of Government Proceedings dated 20th April 1869, No. 506, remarking that "there are no carts, and it is not clear why a sum of Rupees 30 is entered in the detail of estimates for 'repairing carts, &c.'," I have the honour to state that there are, and have been since 1866, four carts used for the purposes referred to in the abovementioned proceedings. The total number of scavengers and sweepers is eight, and for each cart there are two of those employed for the purpose of collecting and conveying away in them the sweepings, &c., of the town. If, therefore, any more carts are to be procured, an additional number of sweepers will also be necessary. I am of opinion that perhaps one more cart may be required, though this will involve, besides the cost of the cart, an additional expenditure under the head of conservancy of Rupees 10 per mensem, (i. e., the pay of two sweepers,) and I will, in communication with the other Commissioners, take steps for procuring one.

No. 42. ORDER THEREON, 8th June 1869, No. 764.

The Government do not consider the arrangement adopted in the Cumbum Municipality for the conservancy of the town to be such as to ensure the speedy or effectual removal of the filth and sweepings separately.

2. Four carts would seem to be insufficient to dispose of the filth and rubbish of a town of the size of Cumbum. The President is requested to ascertain whether, under the present arrangements, the conservancy establishment is efficient; and, if not, to take the necessary steps for increasing it.
