2. Among the 163 men (including 5 natives of India) men who entered the Service during the period in question, there have been 15 deaths and 10 retirements from various causes as noted marginally.

4. We have no reason on the whole to think that the selected candidates were not sufficiently robust.

5. We have not thought it necessary to consult any officers outside the Secretariat. The general knowledge regarding the Civil Service possessed by the Members of Govt. enables us to state that the majority of the Service are men of average health.
