Read the following letter from H. NEWELL, Esq., Acting Collector of Guntur; to J. GOLDINGHAM, Esq., Commissioner for the Northern Circars; dated Moondradoo Dindhy 11th June 1856, No. 79.

Sir,

1. I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 96 of the 7th February 1856, and to forward a revised statement of lands to be given in exchange for service Enams rendered useless.

2. The lands previously proposed to be given to Washermen, Barbers, and others of that class, have now been excluded from the statement in accordance with your instructions, and the parties will have the option of retaining them at the full quit rent or resigning them altogether.

3. The items for the Carnums and Peddarapooas have also been entirely withdrawn, as I have since found that as recently as in Pady 1264 they were allowed to throw up the unproductive portions of their Enams, when the lands now alleged to be also of the same kind were retained as cultivable, and it is to be inferred that although they may have become impoverished, they are not of such a nature as to call for an exchange.

4. The exchange of Meltsud Enams has been reduced from Acres 220 Coontals 34 valued at Rupees 231-8-10 to Acres 133 Coontals 33, assessed at Rupees 195-6-3, as the unproductive portions can be resumed to such extent as will leave a sufficient provision for the number of Morauda required to be retained. The Government having in Extract Minutes of Consultation dated 2d August 1849 resolved that where Enams exist for this class of servants, they should not in future be superseded by money payments, it is very necessary that the present provision should be made for a productive source of emolument.

5. Of the Vetty Enams 250 Acres, 34 Coontals assessed at Rupees 332-0-3, have been struck out of the list, as it is not necessary to renew this portion by fresh grants, the remaining emoluments being considered sufficient, the extent of 91 Acres, 7 Coontals now recommended to be given in exchange is on account of those whose remuneration is small, or whose lands are unfit for cultivation.

6. With reference to the Shroff Enam 17 Acres, 14 Coontals are proposed to be resumed, leaving the remainder 35 Acres, 27 Coontals in the occupancy of the Shroffs, which considering their number and the duties to be performed would appear sufficient.

7. In the item of Cuttoobady Enams, the quantity proposed to be unconditionally resumed is Acres 175 Coontals 2 bearing an Assessment of Rupees 244-10-1, the services of some of the Cuttoobadies being dispensed with in places where not much required, and the remuneration of others were found to be excessive being reduced to a suitable standard. The exchange now proposed is only in cases where the allowance is small, and the land useless and is confined to the Palnad, where the services of this class of servants are needed in the Frontier and the hilly tracts which are out of the reach of constant visitation by the ordinary establishment.

8. The subjoined abstract of the enclosed Statement revised in the manner above described shows the aggregate quantity of land proposed to be exchanged, the quantity to be resumed, and that which will remain unaltered.

No. 2. General Revenue Commission, No. 72, dated 21st January 1857.

With the above letter the late Commissioner to the Northern District submitted for the orders of Government, a statement of lands proposed to be given in exchange to village servants in Guantao, whose Enam had become unfit for cultivation. The statement is a modified one, embracing Enams in Guantao, Headsapook, Meistatook, Vaitak, Simoh and Cuttabuddies, but the manumission of Barbers, Washermen, and Potmakers, had been excluded under instructions from the Commissioner, communicated to the Acting Collector in his letter of the 7th February.

2. The Government do not however concur in this distinction. They consider it undesirable to break up the long established form of the village economy, by refusing the same indulgence to Potmakers, Barbers and Washermen, as to the other Manumissions; and they request the Board of Revenue will be good enough therefore to call for and submit a statement of the items struck out by order of the Commissioner, as they are of opinion that the whole of the Enams should be replaced to the classes excepted as well as to the others.

3. An abstract of the whole extent of land proposed in the present letter to be exchanged, the quantity to be received, and that to remain unsold, is given in para. 3 of the Acting Collector's letter. The extent of land recommended to be now made over to the village servants is A. 305, G. 39 assessed at Rs. 417-3-0 in lieu of A. 312, G. 35 assessed at Rs. 425-1-4, rendered unsuitable chiefly by the soil on the rocky substratum having been washed away by the hill streams. As this exchange it is stated, will secure sufficient remuneration to the village officers, Government sanction the arrangements as proposed. As a general rule they do not consider that the Enams at Cuttabuddies need be renewed; they have already remarked more of the nature of pensioners than officers; but they have been induced to allow the indulgence in the present instance, as the Collector states that the services of these Cuttabuddies are required on the frontier and in hilly tracts not easily reached by the ordinary establishments.
