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Fort Saint George, Revenue Consultation of 20th January 1857.

No. 1. Read the following letter from J. D. SIM, Esq., Acting Secretary to the Board of Revenue; to J. D. BOURDILLON, Esq., Secretary to Government, Revenue Department, dated Fort Saint George 12th January 1857, No. 111.

SIR,

From Collector 21st in Cons. 30th Oct. 1856.

With reference to Extract from Minutes of Consultation dated 28th October 1856, No. 1142, I am directed by the Board of Revenue to submit herewith, the accompanying further correspondence with the Collector of Chingleput, regarding the provision of a new Cutcherry for his District.

2. The building which the Collector proposed to purchase as a Cutcherry was visited by the Board and condemned. The District Engineer has prepared estimates for an entirely new building, and these are under the Board's consideration.

3. In the meantime the Collector proposes to transfer the Treasury from Conjeveram to the Talook Cutcherry at Guindy. All that will be necessary, in Mr. Shubrick's opinion, is to put up an iron railing which can be brought from Conjeveram. The building is in other respects secure, and the Sepoy guard can be temporarily accommodated within it.

4. Mr. Shubrick states that if the Treasury is transferred, a sum of Rupees 60,000 might be set aside at the end of each month, for meeting the demands in the ensuing one. The arrangement for the transfer of the Treasury is approved by the Board; but as Guindy is so near Madras, they are of opinion that the surplus Cash, whenever it amounts to a certain sum (say) Rupees 5,000, should be forwarded to the General Treasury, instead of being allowed to accumulate until the end of the month. The sum retained should also be reduced to the smallest amount likely to meet the ordinary requirements of each current and succeeding month.

5. The Board recommend that, pending the construction of the new building, the Collector may be authorized to transfer the Treasury to Guindy as proposed.

No. 2. ORDER THEREON, No. 59; dated 14th January 1857.

Pending the construction of a suitable building for the Cutcherry of the Collector of Chingleput, the Government authorize the transfer of the Hoozoor Treasury of that District, from Conjeveram to the Talook Cutcherry at Guindy, as proposed by the Collector and the Board of Revenue; proper precautions being taken for the security of the Treasury.

2. Adverting to the Collector's proposal to detain a sum of 60,000 Rupees at the transferred Treasury every month to meet current expenses, and to remit all surplus to the General Treasury at Madras, the Government observe that the amount detained each month should vary according to the probable expenses of the month, and should not be a fixed sum, unless the monthly disbursements are very nearly invariable.

3. The Board will be good enough to consider and report what reductions may be effected in the Treasury Establishment, in consequence of the diminished amount of Cash retained, and of the less quantity both of responsibility on the Cashkeeper and of work for his establishment.
