respectfully soliciting the attention
of Government to the very little aid
I have had for many months
past, in the management of this
large and important District,
and in again requesting that
Government will be pleased,
speedily, to depute a Gentleman of
some little experience, to fill the
Office of Head Assistant.

3. In a Maritime District
like Tinnevely, it is of great im-
portance that a Head Assistant
should be available to overlook
personally the management of the
Sea Customs, and particularly
the Salt Pans, and the numerous
details connected with the manu-
facture and sale of the Salt. Had
my late Acting Head Assistant,
Mr. Arbuthnot, remained in the
District, it was my intention to
have placed him in separate charge
of the Head Assistant's Office, as

soon

soon as he had passed his exami-
nation, which he expected to do in
June, but his services being re-
quired elsewhere, and as Mr. Phum
cannot be detached from Tinnevely,
I hope a Head Assistant may be
sent here soon.

4. On the 20th Instant, I
addressed the Board of Revenue re-
garding the general state of the
District at present, with reference
to the paucity of European Agency
for carrying on business. Since then
I have arranged with the Joint
Magistrate, that he should take
temporary charge of the *Chief de*
tasks of the Head Assistant's tasks,
while I retain the remainder of
the Head Assistant's charge, so
that at present in addition to the
supervision of the entire District,
and all the various general duties
devolving on the Collector, I have
in my own hands, the Current
Revenue

Revenue details of no less than
 nine Talooks, with the land &
 Sea Customs, and the Salt, until
 a Head Assistant arrives.
