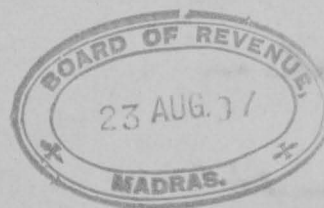

To The Collector of Nellore

Sir, I have the honour to submit my report on the work of the Probationary Deputy Collector and Magistrate Shri P. Sitaramayya Jai for the half year ending 30<sup>th</sup> June 1897.

2. In January and February the Probationary Deputy Collector was mostly at Head quarters doing Magisterial and Municipal and other routine work and occasionally going out either to inspect road repairs placed under his supervision or to make certain local revenue enquiries and to hold sales of tank bed lands. From 1<sup>st</sup> March he was placed in charge of the Nellore Firka to take the place of the Tahsildar in respect of all work connected with that Firka and he continued to be so during

the rest of the half year. During this period he moved in the villages of his Fiske on Azmaish and other revenue work and made himself acquainted with the work of Tahsildar and Revenue Inspector and mastered the jamabandi and other accounts. He was in charge of Atmakur Division for about 10 days in April and of the office of the Forest Settlement Officer for a month and five days in May and June and of the Stationary Sub Magistrate Nellore for 10 days in June. His progress in the Revenue work is satisfactory.

He continued to exercise 3<sup>rd</sup> class Magisterial powers till the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 1896 when he was invested with Second class powers and his jurisdiction consisted from 1<sup>st</sup> March 1897 of the whole of the Nellore Fiske excepting the Municipal Town of Nellore.

The total number of cases disposed of was 77 of which 18 ended in conviction and the rest either in acquittal or discharge.

Against the 18 convictions there were only 2 appeals in one of which the conviction and sentence was upheld and in the other reversed.

Of the 77 calendars of the cases disposed of

only 12 admitted of any remarks being made by  
Divisional magistrate and these relate to minor  
matters of procedure &c.

His progress in this branch <sup>also</sup> is satisfactory

During the whole period under report he was  
in charge of the Nellore Municipality and has  
been doing the work connected with it with care and  
attention, specially the work of revising the Professional  
tax making personal enquiries in some cases and  
checking his Register with the Income Tax Registers  
of the Tahsildar.

He has yet to pass the Criminal Higher  
grade and the test in the Account code and  
is preparing himself to appear for these exami-  
-nations in October next.

He provided himself with a decent horse  
which he often rides. He has yet to pass the riding  
Test.
