READ the following letter from R. H. Shipley Esq., Ag. Collector of Godavari to the Secretary to the Government of Land Revenue, dated 15th January 1897, No. 126.

I have the honor to submit my reports on my unpassed Assistant Collector Mr. Banerji and on Mr. Woodhouse, Probationary Deputy Collector.

8. Mr. Woodhouse arrived on 18th August last. He was assigned the following duties.

9. Magisterial. He exercised 3rd Class powers from 13th October and he checked Sub. Magistrate's calendars. He was given jurisdiction over the town of Secunderabad, and he presided over the Bench Court. He disposed of 29 out of 31 cases sent to him. Against none of his decisions was there an appeal. He convicted in 10 cases. His work in this branch was good.

10. Revenue. He underwent Treasury Training from September to November. He prepared office notes in appeals under Act III of 1895. His notes are full.

full, and deal effectively with the legal aspects of the questions, as well as with the facts. They evince thoroughness on his part. He also passed orders on copy applications.

11. Miscellaneous.—He has worked very hard at Telugu, and is very fairly proficient in it. With more extended practice in villages, and with no one to help him, he will become shortly quite proficient.

12. His work has been good. He is very careful and painstaking, and, I should say from my short acquaintance with him, eminently trustworthy.

13. I propose to send both these officers into the District shortly, Mr. Woodhouse to be in charge of a village as Karnam, and Mr. Banerji to act as Revenue Inspector. During the approaching jamabandi they will be instructed in checking accounts.

14. I only joined this District at the end of November, so that my acquaintance with these officers is very short, and I cannot pretend to have formed any more definite opinion of their abilities and character than what the Board will gather from the above.
