I have the honor to report on the progress of Prob: Dy. Collector, M. R. R. A. Ramacha Nedungadi Avergal during 1896.

2. He joined on the 11th July last. At first he was required to abstract Tamil petitions in order that he might acquaint himself with that language in which he had to pass. In addition to that, he was given a certain amount of magisterial work to do from the beginning of August; and in September and

When he was also required to prepare
 his notes on papers relating to Revenue
 matters such as Murkheast appeals, -
 offer of lands from Poramboke &
 etc. In November he was put in
 charge of the Velacheri Karam's duties,
 & he continued to ^{do} that work (in
 addition to Magisterial work) until
 Christmas holidays - Up to the
 end of December he had 50 Criminal
 cases to dispose of, of which he
 disposed of 49 -

He has shown intelligence, care
 and zeal in the discharge of the
 work given him to do, which was
 fairly high in order to give him time
 to prepare himself for the examinations
 that he had to pass.

He has passed the Riding test.
 I consider him a distinctly promising
 officer.
