READ the following letter from Muhammad Raza Khan Esqre, Collector of Kurnool, to the Secretary to the Commissioners of Land Revenue, dated 19 January 1899, No. 13.

I have the honor to report as follows on the work and progress of the Probationary Deputy Collector, Rafiul Woolk Sahib Bahadur, during the half year ending the 31st December 1898.

2. He joined his appointment on the 10th October last and for about a fortnight was mainly engaged in studying for the Preis and Criminal Higher Tests held in the latter half of that month. As directed by me he helped the Treasury Deputy Collector for some days when the latter examined the Treasury balance etc. In November I made him for a few days receive petitions for me, and translate them into English for my perusal and orders, and then sent him for a few days with the Pyapali Deputy Collector to some adjacent villages of the Ramallakot

Ramallakot Taluk to see the village accounts and have an idea of how they should be prepared and checked. He inspected some fields of those villages and checked the cultivation accounts. In December I sent him with the Treasury Deputy Collector to Vandikothkur to aid the latter in examining its Taluk Treasury. During the Christmas vacation he was chiefly engaged in preparing for the compulsory Vernacular test held at Madras in the beginning of this month.

3. He is steady and industrious and has been gradually acquainting himself with the important Acts and Regulations relating to Revenue and Criminal matters; he was invested with third class Magisterial powers towards the close of the half year under report. I submit that better progress may be expected during the current half year.
