22nd April 1898, the Government
while directing that the full
amount of costs and damages
awarded to Miss Aubley in certain
forest suits, should be paid into
the District Court of N. Arcot,
requested the Board of Revenue to
ascertain and report whether it
was desirable to institute a suit
for Contribution from one Mr
David Heppen and two of his
agents who were Co-defendants
in the said case. The Board of
Revenue at first reported (so far
as Mr Heppen was concerned) that
it was undesirable to institute
a suit against him for Contribution,
as it did not appear that he
possessed property sufficient to make
it worth while to incur expenditure
on litigation. The Board, however,
now ^{information} furnishes which seems to show
