## Resolution

Referring to Government Order No.

1558 Ry., dated 19th December 1898, copy of which has just been furnished to it in compliance with the request made in its Reference No. 81, dated 25th January 1899, the Board requests that it may now be favoured with copies of the correspondence that has passed between Government and the Oriental Salt Company in reference to its proposal to acquire the Ganjam factory mentioned in para 7 of the Company's letter printed therein.

- The Board observes that Government contemplates the concentration of the salt trade of the north of the Presidency in the three factories now in the Company's hands and the Ganjam factory which they propose to acquire as a "consummation much to be desired in the interests of Government, as permitting of large reductions of Establishment and other Expenses, and as minimising the chances of fraud which are always greater at small
