In para 3 of its Proceedings No. 585 Mts., dated 14th February 1899, the Board recommended that the Government Pleader, Madras, or if he was going on leave Mr. K. Brown, might be instructed to appear on behalf of Government and defend the Periyar temporary suits - S.O. No. 475 of 1898 in the District Munsiff's Court at Tirumangalam. The Government issued the necessary instructions to the Government Pleader who appeared on the 15th February 1899.

ment of issues. Another suit of the same nature having been subsequently posted for hearing in the same Court, the Board requested Mr. Powell to conduct the defence of that suit also. The final hearing of the two suits having since been adjourned till after the 25th instant and the Government Pleader having gone on leave, the Board considers that in view of the importance of the question involved in the suits, Government ought to be represented by a Barrister and accordingly recommends that Mr. K. Brown may be engaged on its behalf. His fee would be Rs. 1000 plus expenses for two days' absence from Madras and Rs. 250 per diem for each subsequent day.

2. The early orders of Government are requested, as the suits will very probably be posted for final hearing shortly.
