Sir. As I am leaving the District
for South Kanara on the 11th Instant,
I beg to submit my report on the work of
the Probationary Deputy Collector and
Magistrate for the half year ending
with 31st instant a few days in advance.
2. During the half year under report
the Probationary Deputy Collector was
put in charge of Allur Division
for 16 days from 19th July to 3rd August.
During this time he got an insight
into the working of a Taluk office.
He visited several villages and
disposed of several darkhast cases
besides other miscellaneous revenue
work and also attended to Collection
work. His progress in revenue work
is satisfactory. He was in charge of
the Treasury from the 20th to 27th September
and

and ^{from} 8th to 25th November during the absence of the Treasury Deputy collector on inspection duty. The rest of the period he spent at Head Quarters in doing Criminal, revenue, and Municipal work.

of is 68 of which 20 ended in conviction and the rest either in acquittal or discharge. Against these 20 convictions there were only 2 appeals in 1 of which the conviction was upheld.

4. His progress in this branch of work may also be considered satisfactory.

5. He continued to do the work of chairman and has been devoting his mornings in inspecting houses for the revision of the house-tax.

6. He appeared for the Criminal (Higher Grade) and the test in Account Code in October and is hopeful of success in these examinations.

7. He has considerably improved in riding. He rode with me on some occasions and he can well manage his horse now. His probationary period expired on the 26th November 1894.

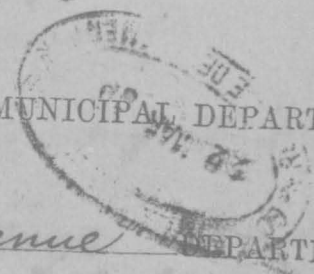

With reference to your endorsement
No 253, dated 4th March 1898, I have the honour to
state that the Probationary Deputy Collector, Mr. R. K. P.
Sitaramayya was Chairman of the Vellore
Municipality from 29th June 1896 to 15th December 1897,
the date of his transfer. From the beginning of
October to the date of his departure he was engaged
in the revision of the House-tax, which involved
considerable labour and took up three or four
hours of his time daily. Otherwise, his work as Chair-
-man was not specially heavy.

My dear Mr. Lockes

In reply to your D.O. of the 22nd I will have to say that when I heard on his joining this District that Mr. B. Collett P. Litchamway was not a first class magistrate as that supposed but only a second class one I went to the District Magistrate of Nassau to ask if he was fitted to exercise first class powers and he recommended in the same to which he replied that he was fitted to do so. It was not then known I think whether Litchamway had passed his examination or not. but before I despatched my letter you refer to it.

M In reference to the remarks of the Honble Sir Henry Bliss at page 4 of the note sketched in the p. 2 of 12th March 1898 No. 1264, the Collector of Podawari was asked to state who was the Collector of Dellore by whom Percy Dy Collector P. Sitaramayya (No 71) was certified well fitted to exercise first class Magisterial powers. Mr. Brodie reports in his D.O. of 16 March 1898 that on Sitaramayya's joining the district he heard that he was not a first class Magistrate as he had supposed, that he wired to the District Magistrate of Dellore inquiring what he was fitted to exercise first class powers & could be recommended for the same & that he got a reply to the effect that he was fitted to do so.

2. The Collector of Dellore refused

to Mr. E. Scott. In the report on the progress made by Sitaramayya during the half year ending 30th June '96 Mr. Scott remarked as follows:—

"I have examined some of the accounts prepared by him & found them generally correct. He must learn however to write with a little more care & neatness"

(vide para 2 of his letter of 25 July '96 No 2844 stitched with sp. of 6 August '96 No 3132)

Mr. Meyer expressed the following opinion in the report for the half year ending 31st December 1896:—

"Mr. P. Sitaramayya is a hard working & zealous young officer and promises to be a useful and efficient public servant."

(vide para 7 of his letter of 15 January '97 No 134 stitched with sp. of 28 Jan '97 No 540)

In the report for the half year ending 30th June '97 Mr. Scott observed as follows:

"He (Sitaramayya) is an officer who takes much interest in his official duties"

"& continues to deserve the good opinion expressed of him in the last half yearly report"

(vide para 4 of his letter of 16 August '97 No 2762 in sp. of 4 September '97 No 4650)

In para 3 of his letter of 16 March '98 No 853 on submitting the report for the half year ending 31 December 1897 he states

"I consider that Mr. P. Sitaramayya has worked with zeal during the half year & he has given complete satisfaction."

3. Inquiry was also made as to the Municipal work done by P. Sitaramayya. It would appear from the Nellore Collector's letter of 17th March '98 forwarded by Mr. & Mr. Septt. that Sitaramayya was the Chairman of the Nellore Municipality from 29th June '96 to 15th December '97 the date of his transfer to Godavari, that from the beginning of October to the date of his departure he was engaged in the revision of house tax which involved considerable labour & took up three or four hours of his time daily & that otherwise his work as Chairman was not specially heavy. The special tax examinations — Account tax and Criminal Highes — for which Sitaramayya appeared last year took place from the 18th to 22nd October '97.
