M.R.R.Y. P. The last letter read above will be submitted
to Government with the request that as suggested by the local
counsel the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India
may be requested by telegraph to instruct the Solicitor to
the India office not to enter an appearance before the Privy
Council in regard to the Pittapur appeal until receipt of the
local counsel's memo, or, if appearance has already been enter-
ed, not to consent to an early posting of the case. The Court
of Wards is prepared to defray the cost of the telegram from
Pittapur funds.

2. The Court regrets that the memo for the guidance of
counsel in England, which the Honorable V. Bhashyam Aiyangar
and Mr. P. Subromoneya ^{Aiyar} Iyer were requested to prepare so far
back as June 1897, is not yet ready. Further delay may serious-
ly prejudice the disposal of the case, and these gentlemen
will therefore be requested to make special endeavours to ex-
pedite the completion of their memorandum in order that it
may be submitted to Government at a very early date. Meanwhile
the Court resolves to submit 6 ^{sets} of the printed transcript
of records for ~~for~~ transmission to the Right Honorable the
Secretary of State for India.

Re Pittapore Privy Council Appeal

I understand that the Plff's solicitor has received a telegram from his London Agents that their appeal is likely to come on for hearing before the end of June. The records which were sent to the Privy Council Office by the Registrar of the High Court must have reached the Privy Council Office last week. It is somewhat difficult to understand the meaning of the telegram said to have been received from the Plff's London Solicitor. If the Solicitors to the India Office has entered their appearance & has signified their ^{Willingness to enter} appearance at an early date, the telegram will be intelligible.

3. Four sets of the transcript of records will be sent to the Collector of Godavari.

4. With reference to Mr. P. Subramania Aiyar's letter of the 21st ultimo, a printed form containing the headings of the Inam Register has been obtained from the Inam Department and will be forwarded to him with the request that he will take the necessary steps to secure formal proof of its authenticity.

Separate orders will be passed on the question of Mr. P. Subramania Aiyar's fee for passing the proof of the transcript of records in the case.

2. The following is the Procedure laid down in respect to the appeals before the Privy Council:

When the records arrive at the Council Office the Appellant's Solicitor prepares his Petition of Appeal to the Queen in Council & lodges the same in the Privy Council Office. But if the Appellant's Solicitor have all the materials before him he need wait till the receipt of the Records to prepare his petition & he may prepare it before hand. The lodging of the petition is a mere formality. The Solicitor for the Respondent on being apprised that the petition of Appeal is lodged, makes appearance & answers the appeal, and a memorandum of such appearance is entered by the Clerk of Appeals in the Council Office. Thereafter no further time

Mr. Mayne has been advising the Plff
since the commencement of the Proceedings
in the District Court. It is otherwise with
