Sir,

I have the honor to report as follows upon the work of the various Probationary Deputy Collectors who worked in this District during the half-year ending on the 30th June.

A. G. Woodhouse

Mr. Woodhouse returned from leave

to England in February and found an offer of the post of 2<sup>nd</sup> Assistant in the Chief Secretariat awaiting his arrival which he accepted. During the few days he was in the District he did nothing except office routine work.



P. Citaramayya

He arrived from Bellary in January

and was at once placed in charge of the Special Assistant Agents

Division. On the 6<sup>th</sup> June he made over charge of that Division

to Mr. Marshall (Pro-bailiary Deputy Collector) and took

charge of the Baryaspet Division. Both his revenue and

magisterial work is very satisfactory. As Special Assistant

Agent he cleared off a good many long pending papers of

which large arrears had accumulated since Mr. Hughes

left the Division owing to the pressure of famine work and the

fact that for 7 months the Sub-Collector had charge of the

Division in addition to his own and could pay little attention

to it. He completed the Jambabandi of the Yellavaram and

Bhadavaram Divisions and did the mal of that of the Polavaram

Division.

As a second class magistrate only he was not able to do

very much but still he disposed of several long pending

preliminary enquiries and charges against the Police and

his judgments indicate that he possesses a good deal of

Common sense and judicial discrimination. I have

recommended him for first class powers.

There were a very large number of suits and appeals

pending when he took charge and in his capacity of Agency

Sub-ordinate judge he did much to reduce the pending file

and the quality of his work was distinctly good.

At Baryaspet since he took charge, he has been doing

very well.

M. S. Marshall

Mr. Marshall only joined the District

on the 6<sup>th</sup> of June last and it is as yet too soon for me to

say much of him. Having only 3<sup>rd</sup> class powers as a magistrate

he is practically of little use as his Head Quarters are

15 miles from the nearest point of the agency and when

he is on tour, the parties to 3<sup>rd</sup> class cases, cannot

well follow him about. He has done the Jambabandi of the

Bhadraachalam Taluk and completed that of the Polavaram

Division.

Sir,

I have the honor to submit a report on the work of Probationary Deputy Collector Vijaya Raghunatha Dorai Rajah during the half year ending 30<sup>th</sup> June 1898.

2 From the 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> January he was in Madras for the Compulsory test in Telugu. He was successful, vide B. P. No 415 Misc. dated 11<sup>th</sup> February 1898. From the 6<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> January he was at Chittoor. From 10<sup>th</sup> January to 12<sup>th</sup> February he was undergoing training in plan-drawing and estimating in the Executive Engineer's Office at Vellore. The report on his progress which was satisfactory was recorded in B. P.



No 1064 Misc dated 18<sup>th</sup> April 1890. He returned to Chittoor on February 13<sup>th</sup>, and from February 15<sup>th</sup> to March 13<sup>th</sup> was on privilege leave. On April 8<sup>th</sup> he went on Extraordinary leave as Comcillon of the Pudukkotta state.

3 During the short time he was at Chittoor he attended to general work in the Collector's Office, and also studied Revenue Law. At Chittoor and Vellore he as 3<sup>rd</sup> Class Magistrate satisfactorily disposed of 9 Criminal cases.

4 As he was so short a time in Chittoor it is impossible for me to say much about his progress, but he showed interest in his work.
