FOR ORDERS.

A copy of the Memorial to the Secretary of State submitted by Subba Nayudu of Dornala on the 20th October 1862 is furnished by the India Office.

In para 4 of this Memorial it is stated that Subba Nayudu (the grand father of the Memorialist) inherited the Dornala Zamindari from his ancestor who acquired it from Muhammedan Rulers and had possession thereof until fasli 1211 (1800-1); that, when the Govt. of Madras took the Ceded Districts, Col. Munro (the first Collector) resumed the whole of the Zamindaris & Polierpts in those districts and granted pensions in lieu thereof; that Subba Nayudu (the grand father of the Memorialist) & his heirs were granted in perpetuity a pension of Rs 2470-2-8 per annum (less

a Tohake or 10 p.c. on account of waste land
and that in 1814 the aggregate annual
pension was fixed at Rs 2906-15-1
which Subba Nayudu received until
1828 the year of his decease.

It is not contended anywhere in
this Memorial that a Sanad-i-Milliyat
Estimrar was granted by Govt
under ~~the~~ Regulation of XXV of 1802
in respect of the Dornala estate
or that the resumption of the
estate by Govt was temporary during
the illness of Subba Nayudu (the
grandfather of the Memorialist).
The Memorial concludes with a prayer
that either the pension be continued
to the Memorialist or the village
originally resumed by Govt be
restored to him.
