Resolution

In continuation of Board's
Proceedings n^o 3993 misc, dated 10th October
1898, the Board begs to submit for the in-
formation of Government a preliminary re-
port from the officer deputed to investigate
the matter of opium smuggling into Malabar,
Travancore and Cochin detailing the results
of his investigations on the west Coast. There-
from there would appear to be no doubt that
systematic smuggling of opium is going on and
has been for some years past. Mr Stanley is now
proceeding to Indore to attempt to trace the
Consignors

2 Meanwhile, the attention of
the local Salt, Abkari and Customs Officers
has been drawn to the matter and they have
been instructed to carefully watch all suspected
parcels. It would greatly assist them in doing
this if Government would arrange for inti-
mation being given them of the arrival at
stations on the Madras Railway of

parcels from the Central India Agency and for permission to occasionally to inspect the railway books. It is requested therefore that the Agent and Manager may be addressed.

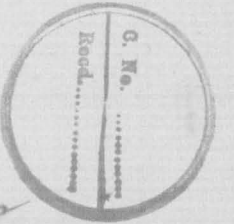
