SIR,

I have the honor to submit the following report on the progress of Subdy. Kodayanalla Venkatasane Grinivasa Arjanga Aravagal, Deputy Collector on probation, for the halfyear ending 31st Decr 1896. I submit no report in respect of Mr. J. F. Bryant, as he passed the Higher Standard Examination on the 1st July, and during the three days in the halfyear that he was an unpassed Assistant, he was on private leave.

2. Mr. Grinivasa Arjanga, as reported in my letter dated 6th July 1896 No. 16 (Confidential) was in independent Revenue charge of the Avanigadda Deputy Tahsildar's Division at the commencement of the halfyear. He remained in charge till the 22nd Sept Mr. Williams, Head Quarter Deputy Collector, was then

telegraphic order from the Government, transferred to Kellore, and there being no other office available, I was obliged to place Mr. Srinivasa Aiyangar in Revenue charge of the Head Quarter Division until a successor arrived, the Head Assistant Magistrate taking Magisterial charge. He retained charge of the Division until the arrival of Mr. P. Radhnikanarasimhan Pantulu Gow on the 22nd October. In the meantime, the Treasury Deputy Collector, Mr. T. V. Narayanaswami Aiyar was taken ill with a serious attack of fever and incapacitated for work, in consequence of which he obtained 35 days privilege leave. Mr. Srinivasa Aiyangar was placed in charge of the Treasury from the 3rd October to the 7th November, and as Mr. Narayanaswami Aiyar on his return to duty proceeded on inspection of Sub-Treasuries, Mr. Srinivasa Aiyangar was left in charge of the current work of the Treasury till the close of the year. He had no formal Magisterial charge, but a number of cases were from time to time made over to him.

3. During this period, he disposed of 13 Magisterial cases + 35 Rent suits. His work in these cases was good, as was also his work in charge of Ananipadda and the Head Quarter Division, and I consider him fit to hold Divisional charge.

4. All that I have seen of his work, confirms the opinion that I have already stated that he is a very promising

young officer.

5. He appeared in October for the Special Tests which he had not yet passed, but the results are not out so far.

6. He owns a horse + rides well.
