SIR,

I have the honor to report
the work done by the Probationary
Deputy Collector Mr. T. Vijin-
rahasachariar during
the half year ending 31st December
1899.

2. The Revenue work done by the Probationary
Deputy Collector during the half
year has been of a varied nature.
He was placed in charge of the
accounts of Thirumarajapuram
village in July and is understood
to have acquired a good know-

ledge of village accounts. He inspected
the Karam and munsiff's accounts ^{in twelve villages}
in December. He was also ~~been~~ engaged
in various inspections connected
with revenue petitions and in the
inspection of the income tax, loans
and other records of two or three taluks.

He further superintended the village
Officers special test examinations
in July and the survey school
at Nanpuresi in October and
November. He has also from time
to time abstracted Vernacular
petitions received in this office
and prepared draft orders thereon.

3. The Deputy Collector has not
done much magisterial work.
He disposed of 17 magisterial
cases and conducted the pre-
liminary inquiry in three sessions
cases. He was in charge of the
Ottapudaram Submagistrate's Office

from the 28th September to the 15th
October. He inspected the records
of two Submagistrate's Offices
and a few sub-jails. Submagi-
strate's Calendars were also during
a portion of the half year sent
to him for perusal and remarks.
4. Other miscellaneous work, such
as the inspection of union ac-
counts in three unions and
of local Fund hospitals in
two stations were also performed
by the Deputy Collector.

5. I am not in a position to say
much as to the character of the
Deputy Collector's work. His re-
marks on magisterial calendars
which have come to me evince com-

desirable intelligence, but they were
submitted in many cases after
very great delay. His inspections
have not in all cases been as
thorough as they might have
been, but, I believe he has tried
his best.

I have not submitted any report
on the work of Assistant Collector
W. Waller as he has been in
charge of the Sherrinadivi Division
since 10th October 1898 and I
presume therefore no report is
necessary.

I have the honor to report as follows upon the Probationary
Deputy Collectors serving in this District:-

Mr. A. G. Woodhouse.

Mr. Woodhouse relieved Mr. Marshall as Deputy
Collector in charge of the Agency Division about the middle
of October and was shortly afterwards invested with 1st class
magisterial powers. Both his revenue and magisterial work
is satisfactory being marked by diligence and thoroughness.
His civil (judicial) work also shows that he has a fair
knowledge of the law. He is an energetic young man and
has already acquired considerable personal knowledge of the
very extensive Division.

Mr. P. Sitaramayya

Mr. Sitaramayya was in charge of the Narasapur Division

in July and August doing all the revenue work and all the
magisterial duties he was eligible to perform as a second
class magistrate. He turned out a great deal of work
and his decisions show him to be a painstaking and thorough
man. From the middle of September to the end of October
he was on privilege leave. During November and until the
holidays he was in charge of the Head Quarters Division
whilst the Head Quarters Deputy Collector was undergoing
Innesway training. He turned out here as good work as at
Narasapur. As soon as he passes the Criminal Higher Test
examination he will be recommended for first class powers
for which he is fully qualified. Generally speaking he is all
round a promising officer.
