(Continued from page) The Darmasaram portion of 9 1/2 Village consists of 40 7/8 Villages of an equal balance. They are enjoyed as shown in the preceding list - The Lands are divided & Drylands are uninclosed. Exchange of lands takes place once in 9 or 11 years - Porcupine paid on the meadow Villages equally - The standing shareholders in the 16 say that they have no documents to prove that they are rightful owners of the Village. The furman has a "Karamat" account of the account showing the distribution of - Villages made in the year Simansa or A.D. 1796 - This account contains the names of the ancestors of the persons N<sup>o</sup> 1-9-16-20-21-22-23-25 & others of 16. It is natural & usual to have such an old account with the inquiries. Again the furman's account seems to be a genuine one - From the evidence of the neighboring Villagers it is proved that the <sup>same</sup> are the rightful owners of the Village - There is no account -
