Case No. 999 - Affidavit of Devanavakampilla, to purchase, dated 26 June 1855. In this case, a copy of the Proceedings of the District Court of Simonsville, dated 20 May 1856, in Springes No. 31, is given in which the present petitioner and the persons of the village were prisoners & were acquitted. Para 9 of the said P.O. states further: - "Under all these circumstances I concur with the opinion in holding the deed alleged to have been forged by B. P. O. Prisoner to have been really imposed by the H. C. Wharf at the time of its execution as it now stands." The reason document argued by the Officer the President is then declared to be genuine one by the District Court which tried the Petitioner. The officer of the prison in this very case - a B. P. O. Prisoner, is entitled to the benefit of such decision. The person who sold the ground to the Prisoner is required to be heard & to have a fair trial or hear the answers of the Prisoner. The ground which was argued to Devanavakampilla is now not given or
