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This is a grant made by the present Government in 1809 to Thastur Subadar for his services. His wife enjoyed after him; and after her death, it was resumed in 1254.

The lands were made over and Patta in the names of Pige, and the Main continued in the resumed condition till 1859. Then after a claim, an enquiry was held, and Government confirmed the whole Main to Thastur Subadar's son, Anthony vide Collector's Order dated 16th June 1859 No. 150.

The Maindar was summoned, and he appeared once, but went away without filing any statement, or producing any sannad.

The Maindar appears by Vakil and produces an endorsement of order of Government dated 12th August 1859 and copy of C. M. O. dated 14th April 1859 No. 554 (Revenue Department). From these papers it appears that in 1807, two grants of 50 and 40 Acres of Panna lands respectively were made to Abdul Haider and Subadar Thastur, for eminent fidelity to the State during the Hellors Mutiny, that the descendant of Abdul Haider have been in the enjoyment of their 50 Acres, in the Trichinopoly District, but that the Main confirmed on Subadar Thastur was partly resumed in 1820 and totally in 1844. The resumption was made because there was no sannad.

The Government remarks "that the 2 grants intended to be made on precisely similar terms, and that the sannad held by Abdul Haider's descendants, show that the Main was confirmed on him and his heirs in perpetuity. Government therefore directed that the 40 Acres of land originally granted to Thastur Subadar be restored to his son (the petitioner before Government) and that the whole proceeds of the Main since 1844 as also the produce of the portion in 1820, be paid to him, with interest at 5 per cent.

Under these circumstances, the Main appears to be a Sarva Main granted to the grantee and to his heirs in perpetuity, but the powers now to be granted by the Rules of the Commission were not granted to him. I would therefore confirm the Main at 1/8 Dist Rent to be agreed to or not at the option of the party.

of 25th January last, I have the honor to report on the Inam of Hasturi Subadar mentioned therein.

2 An extent of 32-13-²² ^{ml} ^{he} ^{are} ^{cont} or 52-84 of wet land at Sivalaperi in the Changaneri Taluk was conferred in 1807 as "Surva" Inam by the present Government on Hasturi Subadar for his services in the East India Company's Service.

3 Of the total extent 7-10-²² ^{ml} ^{he} ^{are} ^{cont} or 12-18 of lands only was 2 crop previous to the grant.

4 Hasturi Subadar died in 1820 and his wife in 1844.

5 The Inam was resumed partly in 1820 and entirely in 1844. During the above period, Fasalgasti was raised on some of the one crop lands by the ryots, and on this half kanyah tirwah, was assessed; but when the Inam was restored to the original grantee's son

E.M.C. 12534 of 14th April 1859. Antony in 1859, the whole proceeds of the Inam, from 1844, together with the produce of the portions resumed in 1820, as well as the half kanyah tirwah charged as Fasalgasti was paid them apparently without any ground.

6 This Antony enjoyed the Inam up to Fasl 1271 without any extra charges on Fasalgasti.

7 The Inam Deputy Collector settled 24-7-²² ^{ml} ^{he} ^{are} ^{cont} as 2 crop and the rest 8-12-²² ^{ml} ^{he} ^{are} ^{cont} as one crop. In Fasl 1275, the latter was cultivated with 2nd crop and charged with water rate ie Rupees 102.

8 The Collector of Trichinopoly has replied to the reference made + Copy of which is herewith enclosed.

as respects the Inam of Abdulhader, "that Abdulhader's Inam is entered in the Inam Preliminary Register as one crop land; but as it was discovered during the examination which was made last year that most part of it had been cultivated with 2 crops, water rate was changed for the portion on which a second crop had been raised."

9 Besides, it appears from the records which accompanied your letter under reply, that, the Government have remarked that the 2 grants (to Abdulhader & Hasturi) were intended to be made on precisely similar terms.

10 I am, therefore, of opinion that Fasalgasti assessment should be imposed on the 2nd crops raised on the lands.

11 As the Inam Register forwarded by you bears a correct number and assessment of the land 8-12-²² ^{ml} ^{he} ^{are} ^{cont} in question, a separate statement is not submitted as called for.
