The Palegar's statement specifies the Bering as 186-120. But I would fix it at the Ayakat Bering, as in the village where the Bering was higher we took only the Ayakat Bering.

The Drain was partly confirmed personal and partly in one title. In the Dettam abstract account of 1813, it was not appear have given away this moiety for the choultry, but no more to show when such transaction took place. The Brahmins have appeared for half being Goundampath, and a statement that is change they have not included with 1/3 of the village their statement. They also declare, that their moiety was relinquished by their forefathers for the choultry. I would therefore confirm the whole for the choultry at 1/3 of the village. To be confirmed

The Inamdar's statement, in which they state down the Ayakat as Dry 32 1/2 koi and the net as 14 1/2 kottas. But they show no accounts to establish the Ayakat at this amount. They allege that their cultivation accounts for 1273, show the Ayakat to be 32 1/2 kottas, but the cultivation accounts of such village contain so much of karnam's account, so much that no dependence can be placed on them. The only account available by which we could go, is the amsham Jamma book ayakat account of the Palegar.
