I have the honour to submit a revised Railway Police scheme with reference to G.O., No. 873, Judicial, dated 26th April 1895.

Revised Railway Police Scheme.

\* \* \* \* \*

16. The men at the stations in Madras are supplied from the City Police and are under the control of the Commissioner. Police at the stations in Madras. In Bombay and Calcutta the police at the terminal stations within the city are under the control of the Superintendent of Railway Police and not under the Commissioner of Police for the city. Such an arrangement is obviously advantageous and I would recommend that it may be adopted in Madras. The Commissioner of Police, to whom a reference was made on the subject, stated that he would be happy to transfer the railway stations and railway premises in the city to my charge. He pointed out, however, that an amendment of the City of Madras Police Act (III of 1888) would be necessary. Either the first clause of section 3 of the Act or section 5 must be amended. Probably, it would be best to amend section 5. If this is done, the police employed at the railway stations in the city will retain the larger powers conferred by the City Act, which is an object to be desired.

Order—No. 1142, Judicial, dated 9th July 1896.

The revised scheme for the organization of a body of Railway Police, submitted by the Inspector-General, is moderate in character and meets with the general approval of Government. The Government of India will now be requested to solicit the sanction of the Right Honourable the Secretary of State to its introduction.

3. The Government agrees with the Inspector-General in considering that it is desirable that the police force employed at the railway stations in the Presidency town should be placed under the control of the Superintendent of Railway Police. As pointed out by the Commissioner, this step will necessitate an amendment of the Madras City Police Act III of 1888, and the Inspector-General will be requested to submit a draft Bill accordingly.

Read—the following letter from the Inspector-General of Police, Madras, dated 1st July 1897, No. 2274:—

With reference to paragraph 3 of G.O., No. 1142, Judicial, dated 9th July 1896, directing me to forward a draft Bill for placing the control of the police employed at the railway stations and on the railway lines within the City of Madras under the Superintendent of Railway Police, I have the honour to forward such a Bill for approval.

2. Two courses were open—one to exclude the railway lines from the city jurisdiction, the other to retain them within the city jurisdiction and to give the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Railway Police the authority of the Commissioner under the Madras City Police Act. I think the latter course is preferable, and I have drafted the Bill with that view.

3. I find that, in Bombay and Calcutta, although the Railway Police are under the control of the Inspector-General of Police and not the Commissioner of the City, legislation has not been thought necessary. No difficulty has, I believe, arisen in the matter though, as far as I can see, in Calcutta, certainly by the letter of the law, the jurisdiction over the Railway Police should be with the Commissioner and not with the Inspector-General of Police (*vide* section 4, Act IV of 1866, Bengal). It will, I think, no doubt be best to legislate here to meet any objections that may be raised. Legislation need not be undertaken until the Railway Police scheme is sanctioned.

## ENCLOSURE.

*A Bill to amend the Madras City Police Act, 1888.*

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Madras City Police Act, 1888; It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. To section 5 of the said Act the following shall be added, namely:—

Provided that the Governor in Council may, by notification in the *Fort St. George Gazette*, which he may cancel or vary, at any time direct that the administration of such of the Police within the City of Madras as are or may be employed at any Railway stations or on any Railway premises or within the limits of any Railway or part of any Railway situated within the

limits of the City of Madras, shall be vested in the Inspector-General of Police, and from and after the issue of such notification the powers under this Act of the Commissioner and of his deputies or assistants in respect of such Police shall cease, and the Inspector-General of Police and under his control such officers as shall be appointed by the Governor in Council to be Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Railway Police, shall as regards such Police exercise all the powers of the Commissioner of Police under this Act, save that the power conferred on the Commissioner by section 10 shall, in respect of such Police, be exercised by the Inspector-General of Police alone.

## STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

In connection with the establishment of a separate Railway Police force in this Presidency, it is considered desirable that the Commissioner of Police, Madras, should be divested of authority over the Police force employed at the Railway stations in the Presidency Town, which is at present conferred upon him by the Madras City Police Act III of 1888, and that these men should be placed under the control of the Superintendent of Railway Police. The Bill provides for this.

ORDER—No. 11, Legislative, dated 15th February 1898.

His Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the draft Bill read above, together with the Statement of Objects and Reasons, under Rule 33 of the Rules for the conduct of business at meetings of the Council of the Governor of Fort St. George for making Laws and Regulations, in English and the vernaculars.

2. The Honourable Sir Henry Bliss will be requested to take charge of the Bill.

3. Copies of the Bill with connected papers will also be forwarded with a despatch to Her Majesty's Secretary of State for India.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR INDIA.

MY LORD,

We have the honour to transmit for your Lordship's information copy of a Bill to amend the Madras City Police Act, 1888, which it is proposed to introduce into the Council for making Laws and Regulations, and which was accordingly published under Council Rule No. 33 in the *Fort St. George Gazette* of the 15th instant.

2. The reasons which render some such alteration in the existing law desirable are set forth in the Statement of Objects and Reasons and in Proceedings of this Government, No. 11, Legislative, dated 15th February 1898, copies of which accompany this letter. The Bill will be introduced at the next meeting of the Council, but it will not be passed into law until the receipt of a communication from the Government of India to the effect either that your Lordship has no objection to the proposed measure or that no reply has been received from your Lordship within two months from the date of this report.
