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P R E F A C E.

THE following pages contain the Proceedings of the original Mayor's Court for a short period in 1689 and for the years 1716-19. They were recently discovered at the High Court in the course of a search for other papers. As they do not appear either in the list of Factory Records or in the list of Madras Proceedings etc., preserved at the India Office, I suppose that they are the only copies extant.

The somewhat unusual nature of these records requires perhaps a little more explanation than is needed for most volumes of this series. These Mayor's Court Proceedings are apparently rough drafts, but whether they were ever copied fair I do not know. The system followed in their preparation seems to have been to allot half a page (more or less) to each suit, and to enter together the various steps taken in it. In some cases, where there was much to be recorded, the space originally allotted was insufficient, and the matter was then carried forward to another page. Where this has occurred, I have rearranged the matter, so that the proceedings are printed as though the 'Register' of the Court had been able to forecast just how much space each suit would need. Apart from this rearrangement, the proceedings are printed as they stand.

They contain much curious matter. They show that the Corporation continued to exercise other than merely judicial duties, as for instance in the matter of paving Gloucester Alley; the lists of burgesses and aldermen show that the Corporation continued to represent the various 'casts' as Josiah Child had at first intended--the system which was abolished under the Charter of 1726.

The criminal jurisdiction of the Court is unfortunately not illustrated by the fragment of 1689 which breaks off at the very commencement of a criminal sessions. The later portion however contains a minute report of the trial of three prisoners for murder, and is, I conceive, more than ordinarily interesting as a specimen of criminal justice in the early part of the 18th century. It should be noted that both Grand and Petty juries were empanelled in 1689, but the prisoners of 1718 were apparently tried without a jury.

Lastly it may be noted that the reader will find many familiar names recurring. Thus he will meet with Alexander Hamilton, although there is no indication whether the case in which Hamilton was concerned did or did not give ground for his comment upon the Court's venality. A still more interesting person who appears here is 'Dr. Manuch,' with his characteristic suit against a 'Moorman' to recover winnings at back-gammon. The date of the suit shows moreover that the time of Manucci's death must be assigned to a later period than Mr. Irvine supposed. Yet another well-known name that occurs is that of Job Charnock; and perhaps the passage which relates to him explains why it was said that in his later days he lived in terror of the Mayor's Court. Names which come into prominence in a later generation are Benfield, Orme, Fullerton, Berchere (I suppose a variant of Bourchier), Legou, Fowke and so forth. The connection between some of these persons and their later name-sakes must remain conjectural, but it is more likely than not that the relation is real even though it may now be untraceable.

Cap^t: George Williams appearing in Court, his Atto^y: Delivers in his Answer to the Severall charges in this bill of Complaint, part whereof the Bench

have Consider'd on, & Examin'd the party's on both sides, but time not permitting them to go through wth: this Cause, it's Defer'd till next Court day for a Second hearing.

Order'd that the Plan: & Defe^t: Deliver the Register a List of their Witnesses & that they be sum^d: next Court day.

April 25.—Upon debating the sundry Articles in reference to the Cause in dispute between the Plan^t: & Defen^t: the Court are come to the following resolutions, Vizt:—

That Cap^t: Williams shall deliver to his Owners an Acco^t: p^ticulars of all charges (as Men's Wages &c^a:) disburs'd by him during his Voyage on the above Brigantine;

That y^e: acco^t: of some Tobacco sold by the s^d: George Williams at Atcheen be stated according to the deposition given in by Francis Luis Loubouⁿ;

That a Reasonable allowance be made Cap^t: Williams for Dyet, Charges of, his men &c^a: at Atcheen;

That the Sale of the Brigantine given in by Cap^t: Williams be not allow'd of It appearing to the Court by Evidences given, that she was in a Condition good Enough to be brought to this port & the s^d: Williams having brought her the better half of the Voyage in order thereto; Agreed therefore that such a Valuation shall be put on her as shall be thought reasonable, & brought to the Credit of the Owners & it's further Order'd that Mess^{rs}: Pitt Ellwick, & Turner do prepare & state these accot^s: and deliver them in, with their report, next Court day.

Cap^t: Williams also offering his oath that the amount of the Tobaccoe sold in Acheen was no more than what he has given his Owners Credit for in acco^t., and the Deposition given in last Court day by Francis Luis Loubou not setting forth the quantity of Each sort, Agreed that s^d: Williams's oath be allow'd of, & that the account be stated accordingly.

It appearing to the Court that the Expences Cap^t: Williams Charges his Owners wth: at Mallacca, were disburs'd in the time he stay'd there about his own business more than when he was imploy'd about his owners affairs; and it not being the Custome of this place to allow masters of ships their Charges at the Sev^l: Ports they touch at, The Bench does agree that one third of what charged on this Acco^t: be allow'd of In consideraⁿ: that the Commissⁿ: on the stock is but small.

Agreed that all the other articles of Mess^{rs}: Pitt &c^a: report be comply'd wth:

In compliance to an Order of Court dated the 25th: Ins^t: we are to acquaint you that we have Exam^d: into the Severall articles of Acco^{ts}: between Cap^t: George Williams and the owners of the Experiment Brigantine, as Directed in your forem^d: order, and is as follows:—

• The only particular Acco^t: we Can gett from Cap^t: Williams of his ships Crew, and payments to them, is in our opinions very imperfect & defective, as your Worsh^{ps}: &c^a: may see by his said Acco^t: we now deliver to the bench. We have had depositions upon oath from Salvadore Da Costa, Tandell of the Ex-

perim^t: Brigantine, Davajee Carpinter, & Paul Pois Lascar, concerning Wages advanced and what persons belong^d: to the Experiment Brigantine, upon their arrival at Mallacca. In the s^d: deposition they allow that Cap^t: Geo: Williams paid at Acheen no more wages than to the amo^t: of p:387:18 & at Mallacca no more than pag^s: 250:21:45 w^{ch}: together makes p: 634:3:45 instead of pag^s:815:33:25 he charges as paid at both places. Now since Cap^t: Williams has not produced to us a more perfect acco^t: of wages due to the men, from the time of their four month impress mony (paid in Madrass) expiring; nor any acco^t (w^{ch}: can be call'd Satisfactory) of the Lascars being Entertain'd, discharged, or run away, from time to time, than the Acco^t: beforem^d: we think it reasonable to allow no more than the Sum: of pag^s 634:3:45 w^{ch}: the forem^d: depositions allow Cap^t: Williams did pay.

Wherefore we are obliged to render this matter to the bench's determination.

For Diet, Expences at Acheen, We have allow'd him pag^s: 120 instead of pag^s: 214:18 Charged in his Acco^t: and is for Diet allowed only to three Lascars, a Cooke, Mate, himself & two servants, for 7 months 19 days, which is nearest 16 pag^s: p mens: a Large allowance.

Reg^r : Caudojee, hold up yo^r : hand

Perseram, hold up &cⁿ :

Kistnadoss, hold up &cⁿ :

You stand Indicted by the names of Caudojee, Perseram, & Kistnadoss, for that you the said Caudojee, Perseram, & Kistnadoss not having the fear of God before your Eyes, but being moved, & Seduced by the instigation of the Devil, did on or about Sunday the 8th : day of June, w^{ch} : was in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred & Eighteen, between the hours of Eleven and one, treacherously make an Assault wth : force of Arms upon the bodys of AUSA Dersee Trewadee & Eyangaru, whom you the said Caudojee, Perseram, & Kistnadoss did Barbarously murder, & afterwards robb the said AUSA Derse Trewadee of a Considerable su^m : of mony amounting to Severall thousand Pagodas in, or near, the said AUSA Dersee Trewadee's house in the English burying Garden street & next to the house of Causa Yacombrum, all w^{ch} : is against the peace of our Sovereign Lord the King, his Crown, & dignity, & to the Evil Example of others.

After the Indictment was read in the Severall Languages aforesaid, the follow^r : Questions were put to the Prison^{rs} :

Reg^r : Caudojee, Art thou Guilty of this Indictm^t : or not Guilty?

Ans^r : Not Guilty.

Reg^r : Perseram, Art thou &ca :

Ans^r : Not Guilty.

Reg^r : Kistnadoss Art thou &ca :

Ans^r : Not Guilty.

Reg^r : God send you all a Good Deliverence.

Order'd that Perseram & Kistnadoss withdraw, & Caudojee remain at the Bar.

Questions Put to Caudojee Viz^t :

Que :—How came you by the money the Pedde Naigues Peons tooke from you, w^{ch} : was hid, when you were taken upon Suspicion?

Ans^r :—Perseram & Kistnadoss was Going along the Street when I meet them, & Perseram deliver'd me y^e : money.

Q :—How? at what time? & after what manner?

A :—Kistnadoss came out of Trewadee's house, & afterwards Perseram, when I was going towards Trewadee's, & about ten foot from the door they mett me, saying we are heavy loaden, & bid me take some of y^t : mony upon w^{ch} : Perseram gave me part to Carry home, & bid me deliver it him y^e : next Morn^g :

Q :—How much mony did he Give you?

A :—Two Baggs of Pagodas, & a handkerchief of Jewels.

Q :—Where had you been & where was you going when you mett these two persons?

A :—I had been Sunca Ra^mah's Wedding, & was going home.

Q :—What night did this happen?

A :—On Sunday night Last, being the 8th : Inst^t :

Q :—Did you not ask Perseram & Kistnadoss how they Came by this mony?

A :—Yes.

Q :—When you ask'd them, what Answer did they make you?

A :—They say'd they were going to Carry it up to Arcott.

Q :—Was you never at Terwadee's house?

A :—Yes. I was there Last Sunday night & drank water.

Q :—Was any one Elce there at that time?

A.—Yes. Perseram was sitting on the pyall.

Q. Did you (as you say Perseram bid you) carry the mony to your house & deliver it him next morning?

A. No. The next morning I would have Carry'd him the money, but my Master order'd me to boyl him some rice betimes, & in the interim I hear'd that Terwadee was dead, which almost put me out of my Witts; so that I did not Carry the mony.

Q. Why did not you declare to yo^r: Master, or some one Elce; y^e: you had this mony?

A. That is the reason, I am come to this misfortune.

Q. Did you carry the baggs of mony, & handkerchief of Jewels home wth: you at the same time?

A. Yes.

Q. If so, how happens it that the Jewels & mony were not found in the Same place?

A. They were very heavy & I could not Carry them all at once, besides I was afraid to Carry the Jewels home, as not know^g: who they might belong to, & I inhabited in an other man[s] house, so I bury'd them in the Street.

Q. How Came you to be more afraid to Carry the Jewels into the house than the Mony, or did not you think they w^d: be lost in y^e: street?

A. Because I was to deliver them the next morning, and it was late at night, I did not think it signified much where I put them, besides I was out of my Sences.

Q.—Was you in your Sences when you saw Perseram and Kistnadoss come out of Trewadee's house?

A.—Yes. When I rece'd the mony I was Sensible, but it was upon burying the Jewels [I] Lost my Sences.

Q.—You say'd Just now it was hearing of the death of Trewadee that put you out of your Sences; why do you say now, you lost your Sences upon burying y^e: mony, since that was Done the night before?

A.—Perseram & Kistnadoss told me they had gott a great deal of mony out of Trewadees house, w^{ch}: made me suppose they had kill'd him, so that when I begun to Consider on this matter, it made me mad.

Q.—This Trewadee that was murder'd was yo^r: friend, it seems; why did you not go & see whether he was murderd when you Suspected it, that you might give intelligence thereof?

A.—In case I had not been afraid of the Talliars (who are always going about the town) I would have gon & seen whether he was dead after the manner I suspected, or no.

Q.—Why did you not Carry the Talliars with you & Search the house?

A.—After I carry'd the mony to my Masters house, he lock'd the doors, & I could not get out again.

Q.—Did you not stop in your way home?

A.—I only sate down a little while on a pyall.

Q.—Why did you not acquaint some one of this, in the time you was sitting on the pyall?

A.—It was when I went home into my Chamber, that I begun to Consider upon this affair, & then I first suspected the murder was Committed.

Q.—When you saw Perseram & Kistnadoss about nine a Clock, had you any discourse wth: them in reference to y^e: affair?

A.—When I went to drink Water at Trewadee's house, Perseram & Kistnadoss were sitting on the pyall, & Kistnadoss asked me to go againe to Trewadees house, but I say'd I was going to Sunca Ramah's Wedding; & so I did.

Q.—When you had rece'd this mony, did you go directly to yo^r: master's house?

A.—Directly to my Masters house.

Order'd, Caudojee withdraw, & y^t: Perseram be brought to the Bar.

Caudojee is Withdrawn.

Perseram appears at the Bar.

Interrogatory's put to Perseram:—

Q.—How Came you possess'd of the mony the Pedde Naigues peons found in yo^r: house?

A.—The Night before last night Caudojee brought it to my house, about Nine a Clock.

Q.—Did he give it you, in your own hands?

A.—No, Caudojee & I being particular friends, he came into my back yard, & when I ask'd him what he was doing, he answer'd he was Easing himself, but some time afterwards he told me he had left me some Effects in the Paddy husk Jarr & desired me to take care of y^m:

Q.—Did he say the Effects were for you, or himself?

A.—He say'd they were for me, upon w^{ch}: I answer'd I would take care of them.

Q.—Did you never go to see these Effects, or by any other means know what they were?

A.—No. I never see them, nor did not know what they were.

Q.—But you know this Caudojee was a poor man, & not able to leave you Effects; why was you not desireous to know those Effects? or indeed, how could you imagine he had any to leave you?

A.—I was out of my Witts, & did not recollect.

Q.—How came you out of your witts?

A.—The Astrologers told me I should have ill fortune that day, & reflecting thereon, it made me out of my Witts.

Q.—Where was you Last Sunday night?

A.—My Son Kistnadoss came from S^t: Thoma about nine a Clock on Sunday night last & told me he was very hungry; upon w^{ch}: I gave him some Rice, & we stay'd at home together the remain^g: part of ye night & went to sleep.

Q.—What did you give for Answer to the Pedde Naigues peons when they came to your house and ask'd for these Effects?

A.—I told them I had none.

Q.—How came you to tell them so, since the Effects have been since found in your house, & you Just now declared Caudojee had left some there?

A.—I was out of my Witts.

Q.—How came you (as knowing Caudojee's Circumstances, & seeing him wth: so much money) not to suspect he must have been Guilty of some robbery?

A.—It was my bad fortune not to hit upon that thought.

Q.—How came you to draw your sword on the Pedde Naigues Peons, when they came to take you?

A.—I valued myself upon being ye Rajar's Cast, & having been apprehended & over power'd, I, went to cut my own throat.

Order'd Perseram withdraw & Kistnadoss be brought to the Bar.

Perseram Withdraws.

Kistnadoss appears at the Bar.

Interrogatorys put to Kistnadoss :—

Q.—What do you know of the mony, w^{ch} : was brought, & hid in your Father Perseram's house ?

A.—I know nothing of the money, nor Effects, my Father never told me of them ; the first News I heard of them was when the Talliards came & Seized me & my Father, & then he deliver'd them the money.

Q.—Did you not know nor never had heard from any one that this mony was in your Father's house ?

A.—I never had the least intelligence of it.

Q.—Did you never discourse wth : Caudojee or yo^r : Father about this affaire or Ever hear y^m : talk of it ?

A.—No.

Q.—Where was you on Sunday night Last ?

A.—I was at St : Thoma all night, & came here again about Eight a Clock the next morning.

Q.—How long is it since you was at Terwadees ?

A.—I was but once there, & that was about a month agoe wth : Caudojee, but I have often pass'd by, as I use to go to Caudojee to ask him for five fan^s : he Owed me.

Q.—Did you never see your Father, or Caudojee go to Terwadee's house ?

A.—No.

Q.—When did you first hear of this murder ?

A.—When Terwadee & Eyangaru's bodys were dragg along the streets by Buffaloes Carts.

Q.—You say you was all night at S^t : Thoma ; have you any Wittnesses of that ?

A.—Yes.

Q.—What are their Names ? or what Calling are they ?

A.—I can't tell their names, neither do I know them, but believe I could find them, was I permitted to go to S^t : Thoma.

Order'd Caudojee & Perseram be brought to the Bar, that ye Prisoners may hear what Sev^l : Wittnesses in ye : Cause have to alledge.

Caudojee & Perseram appear at the bar.

Davedoss being sworn, The Bench put the Follow^s : Interrogatorys to him .—

Q.—How came you to send for the Pedde Naigue & his peons to search your house ?

A.—The Night after the murder was Committed I found my Servant Caudojee look pale, & seem to be much Concern'd, upon which I ask'd him what was the matter, but he answ^d : nothing but soon after a handkerchief of Jewells was found near my door.

Q.—Do you know that person at the Bar to be Caudojee ?

A.—Yes, I must needs know him as being a Braminee, & use to come to my house for Charity a Long time, but more Especially because he has lately served me in the house as a Cooke.

Q.—Did you not see the s^d : Caudojee's Clout bloody on Sund^y : night ?

A.—No : but I see him Washing his Cloths, & ask'd ye reason of it, upon w^{ch} : he answerd he had a scuffle with an Englishman, & had Durty'd himself.

Q.—Had you no other reason for sending to the Pedde Naigue?

A.—Hearing of the Murder & seeing this Caudojee very much Confused & running about without giving any acco^t: for his so doing, & knowing but little of his honesty, was another reason.

Q.—When the Pedde Naigues peons came & Seized this Caudojee did he confess anything?

A.—Yes, he told us he had two Baggs of mony in ye house, & there was a handkerchief of Jewills Without doors.

Q.—What time did he come home on Sunday night Last?

A.—About two a Clock.

Naude Laul being Sworn the Bench put the foll^g: Questions to him:—

Q.—Do you know anything of this matter in hand? If you do, pray Acquaint the Bench thereof.

A.—As I was going to Trewadee's house, to pay him Twenty pagodas, I saw Caudojee within, & as I came out, Perseram & his Son Kistnadoss were sitting at ye door on the pyall.

Q.—Are you sure those are the Same people at ye bar?

A.—Yes I am, for I have been acquainted wth: Caudojee about a Year, & the other two persons for near ten years.

Seedee, Perseram's Mistress, being sworn, answers to the foll^g: Questions:—

Q.—Where was you on Sunday night?

A.—At Perseram's house.

Q.—Was he at home all night?

A.—No, he came home as the Clock was striking Twelve.

Q.—Did he come home a Lone?

A.—Perseram and his Son first came and sate on the Pyall & then Caudojee came & brought a Jarr into the house, & went out again, after w^{ch}: they all three Came in.

Q.—Did you not hear a chinkling [*sic*] of Pagodas in that Jarr?

A.—I did say so before the Gov^r: & Council but may be as I was going to sleep, I might be mistaken.

Q.—Did Caudojee Come to the house next day?

A.—On Monday Night, he & Perseram Came together.

Q.—Did you hear anything they say'd?

A.—They spoke very slow [*sic*], & I could not hear them.

Q.—What did you see transacted after the Pedde Naigues Peons came into the house the second time?

A.—I see Perseram deliver them some Pagodas & rupees.

Chungal Riah, Pedda Chitte, Coopana, Periana & Vinkatte Kistna, Peon's to the Pedde Naigue, being sworn declare as follows:—

The Wor: May^r:—Chungal Riah, The Bench Expect you give a p^ticular Acco^t: of what you know relating to the Prison^{rs}: at the Bar, Since you rece'd the Intelligence from Davedoss.

Chungal Riah declared that upon the intelligence of Davedoss he wth: some more peons mett wth: & Seized Caudojee, upon w^{ch}: he (being then Confined upon the Choultry) say'd he was not the only one Concerned in this affair, but if they'd go & bring Perseram & Kistnadoss upon the Choultry they'd tell the whole truth; whereupon they went & brought them there, about 12 a clock at night, & about break of day Perseram told the Peons if they'd go wth: them they'd give them all the mony, which was then in y^e yard, but as they were going Kistnadoss ask'd

Perseram, why he brought all these people to their house, upon w^{ch}: he say'd it's better for us to give them the mony, Elce hereafter we may come into trouble; then Kistnadoss ask'd what mony, but Perseram made no Answer; & they went to their house, & received the money out of a Jarr of Paddy husk in a dark room from Perseram, after w^{ch}: he was going to Cut his own throat, but by a little scuffle they hinder'd him & brought him to y^e Gov^r:

Pedda Chittee declares that Davedoss sent for him & some other Peons & acquainted them there was a Thief in his house, so that when they had found Caudojee they bound him, & he Confess'd there was mony in the Cookeroom, w^{ch}: they tooke away & some time after they had Confin'd Caudojee on the Choultry, they deliv^d: it to the Gov^r: but before they Came to the Choultry Caudojee told them Perseram & Kistnadoss were the chief persons in this affair, & had most money.

Q.—Did you go wth: the rest of the Pedde Naigues Peons to Perseram's house?

A.—Yes, I did, & what Chungal Riah & Pedda Chitte [*sic*] have already sworn, I know to be true as being all of us in Company together.

Coopana declares, what Chungal [peons beforem^d:] have sworn is true, & that he was in wth: them.

Periana & Vinkatte Kistna Declare the same [with] Coopana.

Order'd the Court be kept Silent while the Mayor & Aldermen withdraw to debate this Action.

The Mayor and Aldermen return to their places on the Bench where the following sentence was pronounced by the Mayor:—

Caudojee Perseram and Kistnadoss, you stand indited for robbing & murdering AUSA Derse Terwadde & Eyangaru; you have heard the indictment read to you to which you have severally pleaded not guilty; the Court has heard what you have to say to your defence and the evidence produced against you, and having duly & maturely weighed & considered all circumstances that relate to this horrid fact, they find you guilty of the robbery & murder for w^{ch}: you stand indited. Have you any thing further to urge in your defence before sentence is pronounced upon you?

To w^{ch}: the prisoners returned no answer.

Caudojee Perseram and Kistnadoss, the sentence of the bench w^{ch}: it is my duty to pronounce upon you is that you be taken from hence to the place from whence you came, from thence you [] in a sledge to the place where you comitted [] rable fact; there your beards & whiskers are to be cutt of [as a] mark of Ignominy; from thence you are to be drawn to [the] place of Execution, where the right hand of each of you is to be cutt of while you are yet alive, then to be hanged by the neck till you are dead, & God grant that your example may deter all others from the like monstrous Inhuman & Diabollicall Practises.

Order'd the Defend^t: pay the Plan: Rup^s: 3958 wth: the respondentia of 23 p Cent due thereon. as appears by a bond under the hand of s^d: Defend^t: & Edw^d: Jones.

•The Defend^t: Setting forth in his Answer to the Plan^s: Petⁿ: that the Amo^t: of the Respondentia bond was for the foot of an Invoice of goods provided by M^r: Water: Collett on w^{ch}: he drew his Commission & deliver'd the Defend^t:

& Mr: Jones musters of Each sort, w^{ch}: appears to be true, by Comparing the foot of the Invoice wth: the bond; and the Defend^t: farther sett's forth that at his arrival on the Mallabar Coast, when he open'd the bales the said goods were found Considerably worse than the Musters, Wherefore he brought them back againe in order to obtain a satisfaction.
